The Pride Center provides both **therapy and case management services**. For therapy services <u>we accept Medi-Cal/HPSM</u> and also <u>offer a sliding scale for any self-pay</u> clients. There is currently a waitlist for Medi-Cal, but there are openings for self-pay clinical services.

We currently have openings for individual, couples/relationship, and family therapy. If you or someone you know is looking for LGBTQ+ or gender-affirming and inclusive mental health support, please share our information with them and encourage them to connect with us. We are here to help!

Case management services (navigating housing, employment, gender-affirming care, connection to resources, etc.) are provided at no cost. Services are available to clients located in California. Priority is given to LGBTQ+ community members based in San Mateo County. This year marked the first full fiscal year that Pride Center has returned to in-person (now hybrid) services. We've reached an even greater number of people than ever before, now that we're back on-site and out in the community, in addition to offering our full range of online and virtual programs and services.

Throughout each of our programs and services for FY23-24 (Clinical, Peer Groups, Trainings, Outreach, Events, etc.) we reached a staggering **12,287 individuals!** This is almost 30% more than we reached last year!


Civics 101 Topics

2025 LGBTQIA+ Commission Communication Goals & Action Plan

Overview

The LGBTQIA+ Commission has the opportunity to strengthen its presence and impact in the community through strategic communication. The following goals are proposed: Collaborate to enhance our media¹ outreach, improve internal understanding of communication strategies, and establish clear, measurable goals for 2025.

Goals for 2025

1. Increase Community Awareness:

Expand our presence on social media platforms to ensure the LGBTQIA+ community knows the Commission's events, initiatives, and resources.

2. Promote Engagement:

Facilitate meaningful interactions with our audience through campaigns, Q&A sessions, and collaborations with local organizations.

3. Streamline Internal Communication:

Establish a framework for clear, organized outreach efforts and ensure all commissioners are aligned on messaging strategies.

Proposed Action Plan

Step 1: Foundations

Assess Existing Communication Channels:

Audit current media platforms, websites, and any other outreach methods. Identify strengths, weaknesses, and opportunities.

Assess Key Messaging:

Collaborate with commissioners to develop a consistent tone and style that represents the Commission's mission and values.

¹ Channels of communication, including television, radio, newspapers, magazines, and digital platforms, used to disseminate information to the public. I recommend mostly/only focusing on digital channels (Social media, websites, email, newsletters)

• Develop Training Materials:

Create resources for commissioners to better understand outreach and promotion, including:

- Basics of social media promotion (sharing) and engagement.
- Examples of effective outreach campaigns.
- Tips for tailoring messages to different audiences.

Step 2: Implementation

Launch Media Campaigns:

For example, campaigns highlighting key events, community resources, and success stories. Ideas:

- "Voices of Pride" Spotlighting local LGBTQIA+ leaders and allies.
- "Know Your Resources" Promoting useful community services.

• Build Collaborative Relationships:

Partner with local organizations and businesses to promote events and amplify messages.

• (Optional) Create a Content Calendar:

Organize posts and campaigns to ensure consistent community nurturing and participation.

Step 3: Optimization and Feedback

• Evaluate Performance:

Track for growth, engagement, sign-ups, and attendance at events.

Host Community Feedback Sessions:

Invite the public to provide input on how the Commission can better serve the community through communication.

Document Successes and Challenges:

Develop a report outlining key achievements, lessons learned, and recommendations for future communication leads.

Collaboration on this proposal is highly encouraged to ensure it reflects the diverse perspectives of the LGBTQIA+ community. Ultimately, team feedback is vital to enhance our outreach and build stronger connections with those we serve.










San Mateo County Pride Parade & Celebration June 8, 2024

San Mateo County is committed to hearing from diverse communities. Participant demographics help us understand who we reached and who we may still need to reach when engaging San Mateo County communities. Evaluation surveys help us understand satisfaction and areas for improvement.

Summary:

- An estimated 6,000 people joined the 2024 Pride Celebration and second-ever Pride Parade in San Mateo County.
- **454 participants provided feedback** through a survey for this event.

Participant Demographics:













PRIMARY LANGUAGE SPOKEN AT HOME









GENDER IDENTITY












Pride attendees came from various cities throughout San Mateo County and beyond.
